The Master's programme will train students for a career in political institutions concerned with immigration and integration policies at the national and the international level.

Graduates of Migration Studies will be suitable candidates for positions in governmental organisations as policy analysts and policy advisors, in local and international NGOs and research institutes as consultants.

How to Apply?

The Master's Degree in Migration Studies accepts up to 25 students coming from Tunisian BA but also to students coming from Middle East and Nord Africa, Sub-Saharan Region and Europe.

The Master's Degree in Migration Studies is open for **25 students**: 6 from the University of Tunis El Manar, 6 from the University of Tunis, 6 from the University of La Manouba, 3 from other Tunisian Universities and 4 international students.

The **call is published in June** and students can apply through a specific procedure that can be found on Migrants Website at the section "Students Enrolment".
